

Summer Classes are open to all students who are entering 5th through 8th grade in fall of 2018, attending Lakewood, Randall, Riverview, or Trevor-Wilmot Schools.

Classes begin June 18th and run through July 19th. Classes meet June 18-21; June 25-28; July 5-6; July 9-12; July 16-19.

Students will be able to choose 2 classes. The first class will begin at 8:30am and end at 10:00am. The second class will begin at 10:00am and end at 11:30am. When signing up, please make sure to choose one 1st session class and one 2nd session class. Students will attend both classes every day.

Course Offerings

Cookie Creations

5th through 8th graders join us in the kitchen and learn baking techniques and make some delicious cookies. Learn how to read recipes, measure dry and wet ingredients, proper food handling techniques, and how to double recipes to make MORE (only the really good ones)! You will also get to eat your creations and maybe bring some home to share.

Food allergy ALERT! Please note that this class uses peanut butter, nuts, items with red dye, milk, and eggs in our recipes.

Leadership Games

It isn't summer without some fun and games! This class will work on team building and leadership skills while having fun! Being a part of a team or even working on a puzzle or task together takes special communication skills. This class will equip, empower, and inspire students to tap into those skills by working together in fun, social situations just as they would in the classroom and in daily life.

Get Creative

Are you ready to get Art-rageous? Sign up for this class and you will be engulfed in creativity. Through the use of different tools and medium, students will create and explore different art techniques which may include drawing, painting, pottery/sculpture, and maybe even "mash-up" a few of those to create something completely their own!

Get in Character

Like to use your imagination? Want to express yourself in a whole new way? If so, this class is just for you. This drama class will allow you to experience the thrill of creative live theater while having a ton of fun working with other students. From basic acting techniques to improv and comedy skills, students will get a sampling of it all. This class will build confidence and teach communication skills while working with friends and learning something new. Drama also helps with reading fluency and oral speaking skills.

Explore

Are you full of ideas? Love to problem solve? Are you great at puzzles? This STEM class could be just right for you! Students will get to solve real life problems in this class while they experience each of the STEM elements; Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. This hands on, fun class will incorporate 21st Century life skills, problem solving, and creativity.



Treasure Hunting Adventure

Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container)which is hidden at these locations. Students will learn how to participate in this adventurous, fun activity as well as create their own geocache locations for others to find! Students will need to have a cell phone or tablet with data enabled in order to participate in this class.

Gamers Paradise

Future programmers beware! This class may be too much coding than even you can handle! This is the perfect time to get a jump start on coding. Students will be introduced to various game based coding programs. These programs will allow students to work at their own pace and level of knowledge and achievement and will find useful tools through every challenge. From simple block-style tools for beginners to more advanced challenges for the experienced coder, students will find this class will adjust to their skill level. This class is sure to get students thinking about what goes into the technology they use every day.

Band

Any student who wants to learn an instrument, work on getting better at their current instrument, or even learn a different additional instrument can sign up for our band class. Instructors will work with students to see where they fit best. Morning classes will be for students who are just learning an instrument or those who wish to work with a new instrument but already have been in band. The later session will be for the "experts" who have been playing with a school band in the past. A musical instrument is required to participate. If you do not have your own instrument, please contact your school's band director prior to the first day of class.
